I study phonetics and phonology, focusing on Blackfoot, Mandarin ESL acquisition, and computational modeling of second language acquisition. Mr. Derrick has also worked on computer tools for Linguistics visualization, and am the author of TreeForm, a Syntax tree drawing software tool. TreeForm has been downloaded over 900 times since becoming an open-source project in February, and possible 3-4000 times before that. Andres Salanova (kaitire@MIT.EDU)

Andres Salanova is currently a fifth year Ph.D. student in linguistics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, where he is writing a dissertation on the syntax and semantics of nominalizations, focussing primarily on Mebengokre, an eastern amazonian language of the Je family.

Andres has been studying Mebengokre since 1996, having spent a total of eight months in the field. As a consequence of his originally descriptive background, his current theoretical interests are varied, and include the problem of domains in phonology and morphology, in particular as evidenced by nasal harmony; argument structure and transitivity alternations; the semantics of tense and aspect; aspectually-conditioned ergative splits; nonconcatenative morphology, and lexical category systems.

In the recent past, Andres has taught four seminar-style courses on various topics in phonology, as well as a field methods course with a speaker of Mebengokre, in summer schools in Brazil and Argentina.
