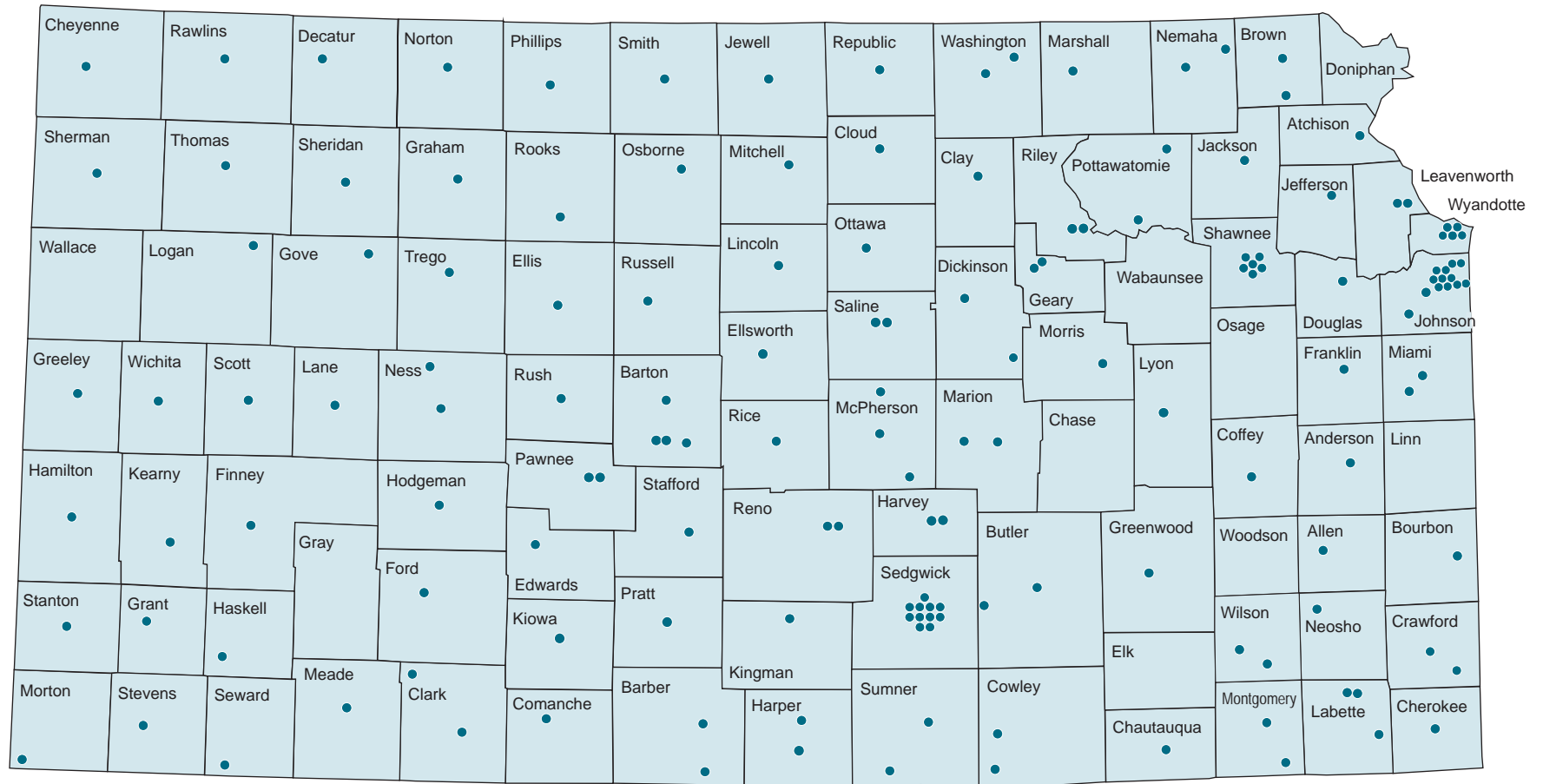

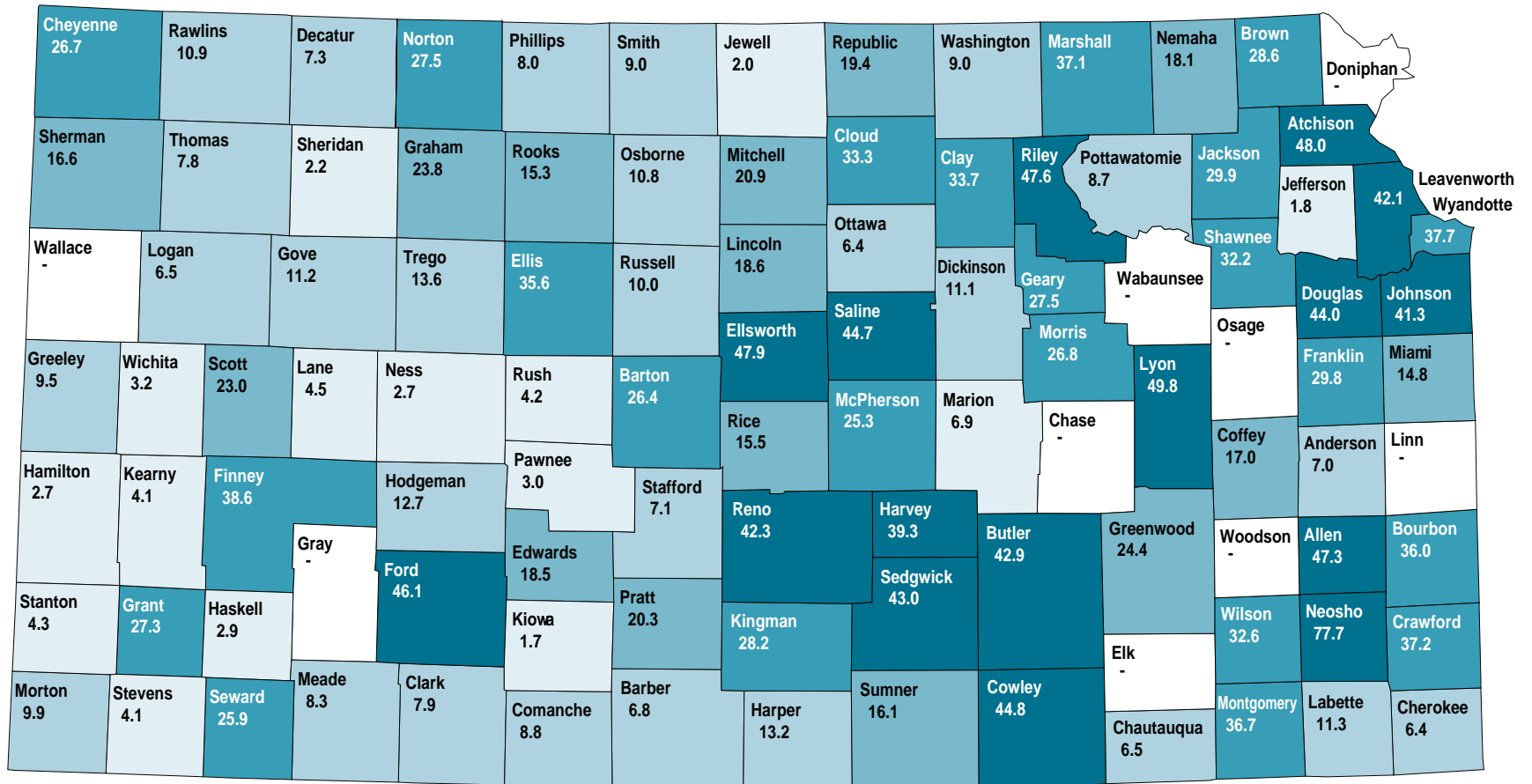
Hospitals in Kansas, 2010

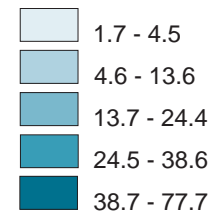
Utilization of Hospitals in Kansas, by County, 2010 Admissions per Bed

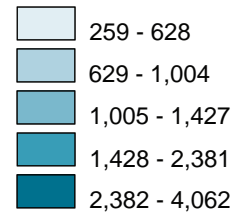

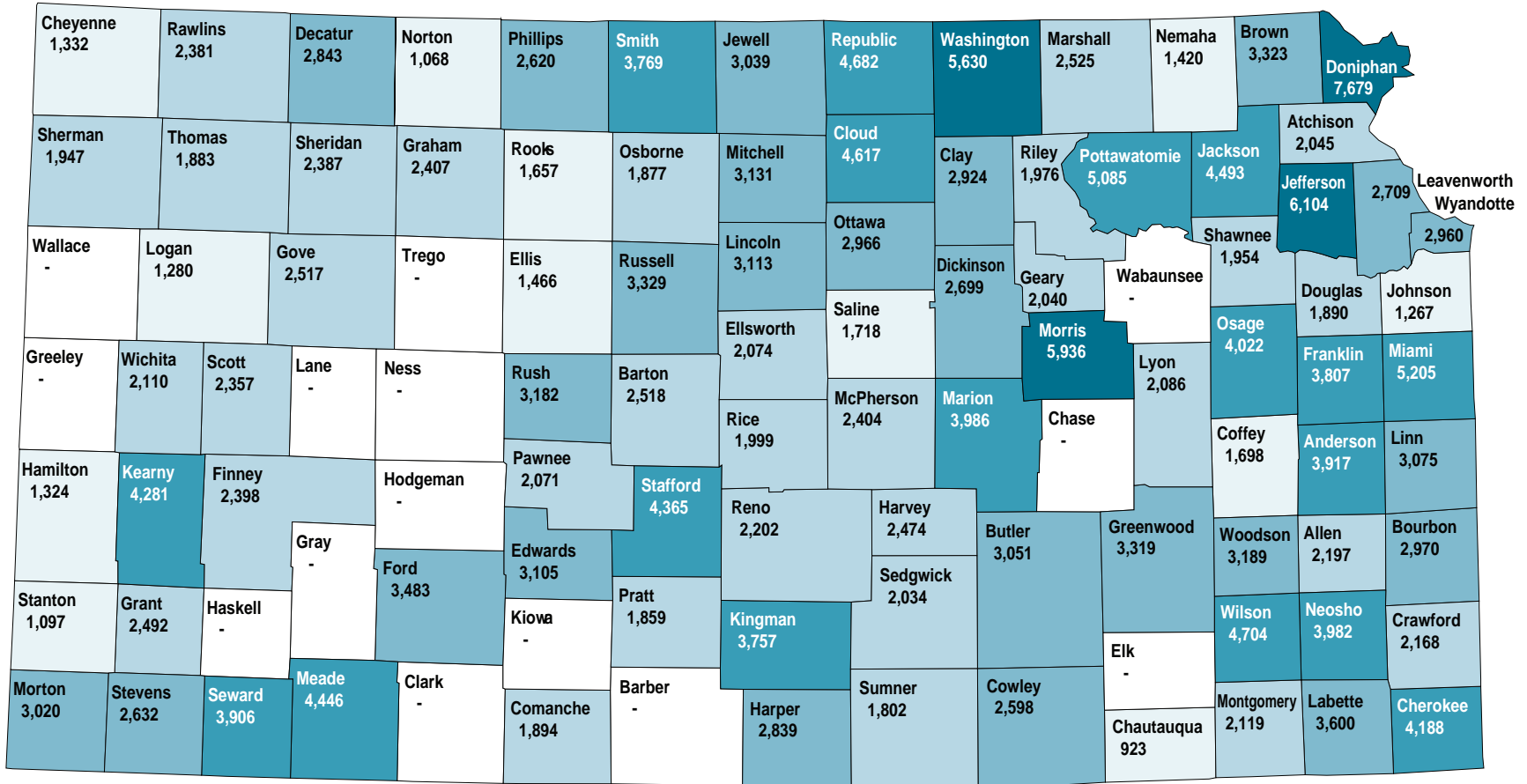

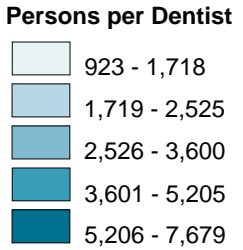

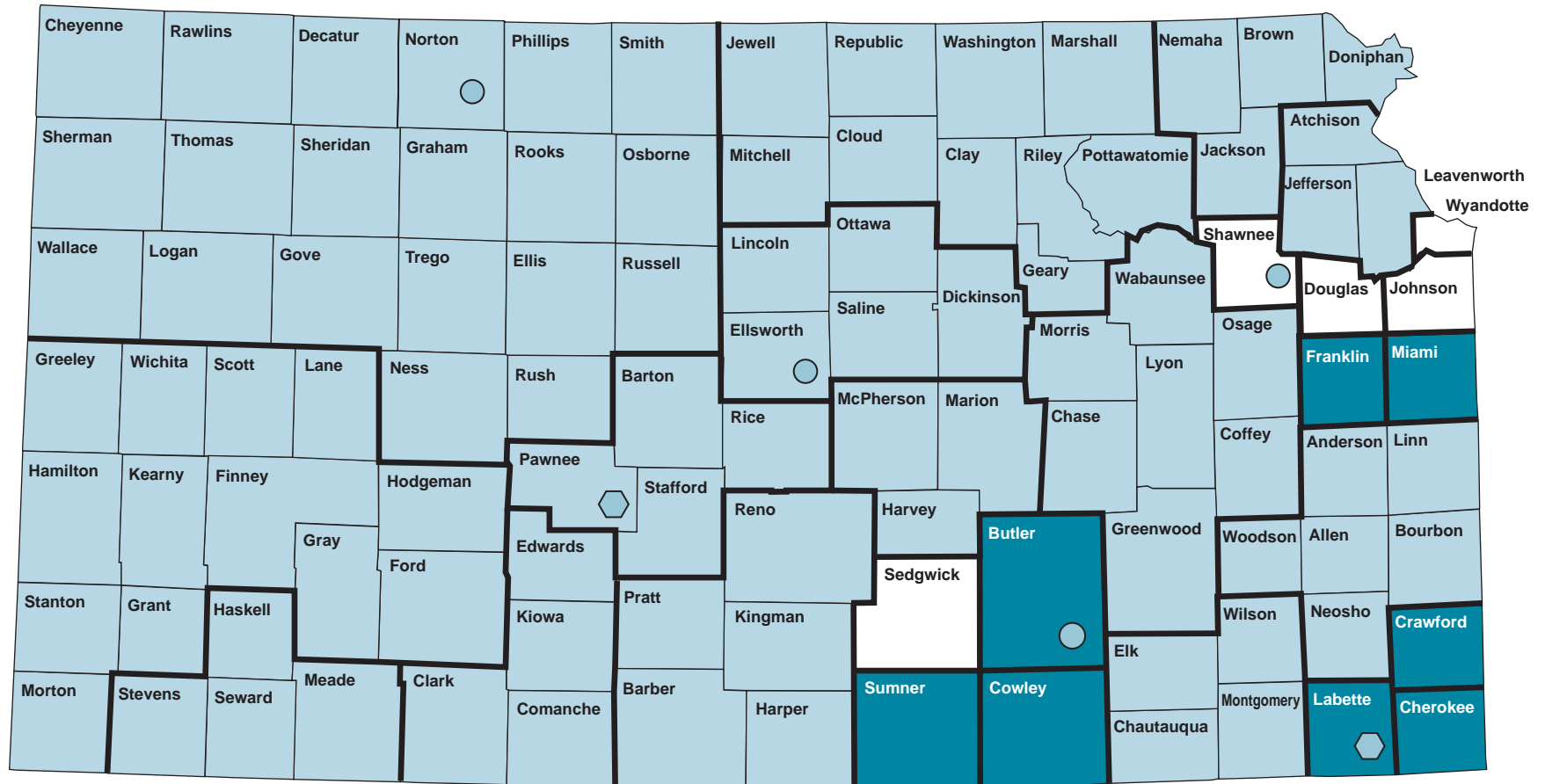
Federally Designated Primary Care Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs) in Kansas, 2011

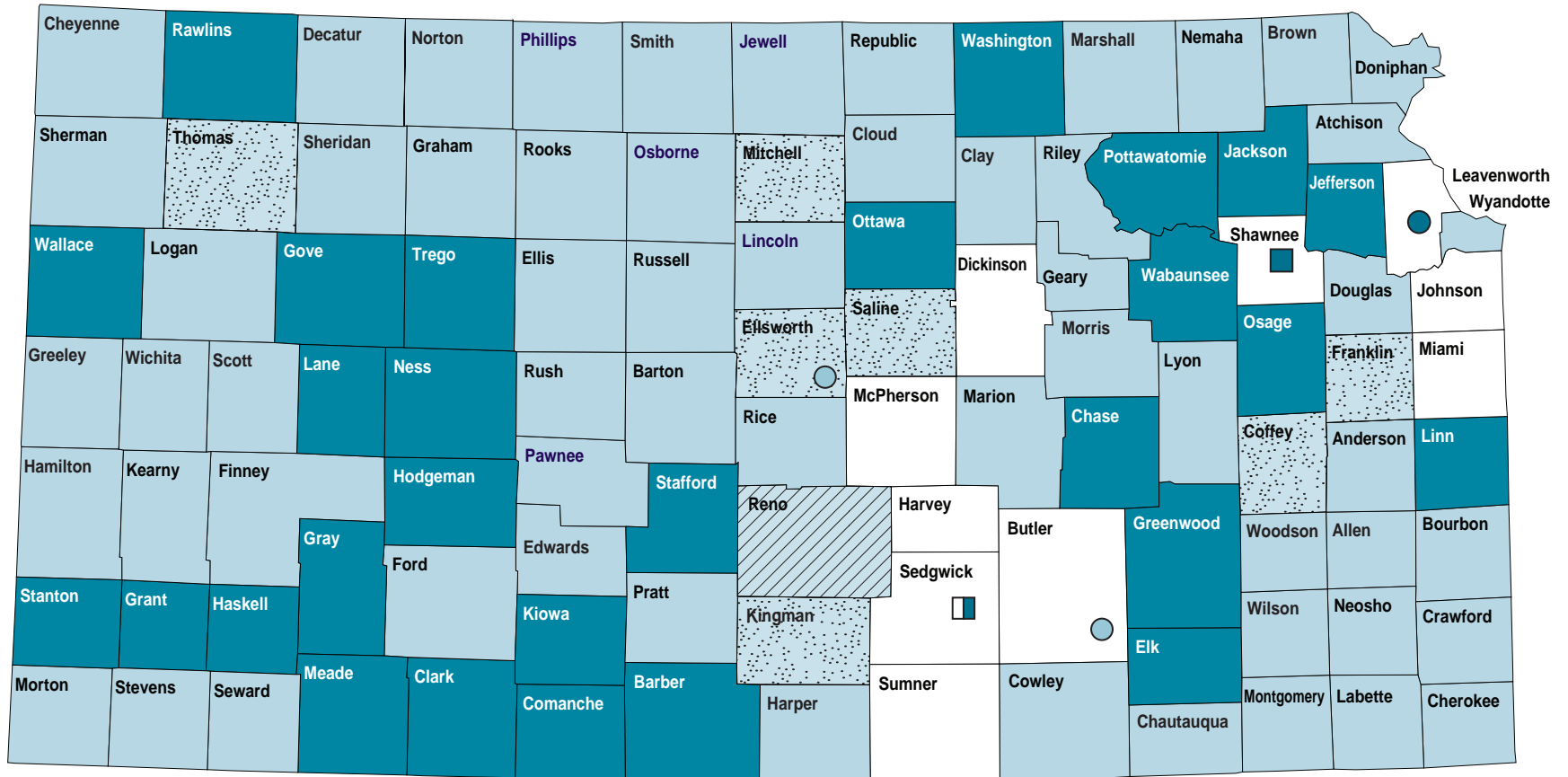



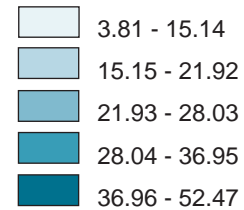
Cancer Death Rates in Kansas per 10,000 People by County of Residence, 2009

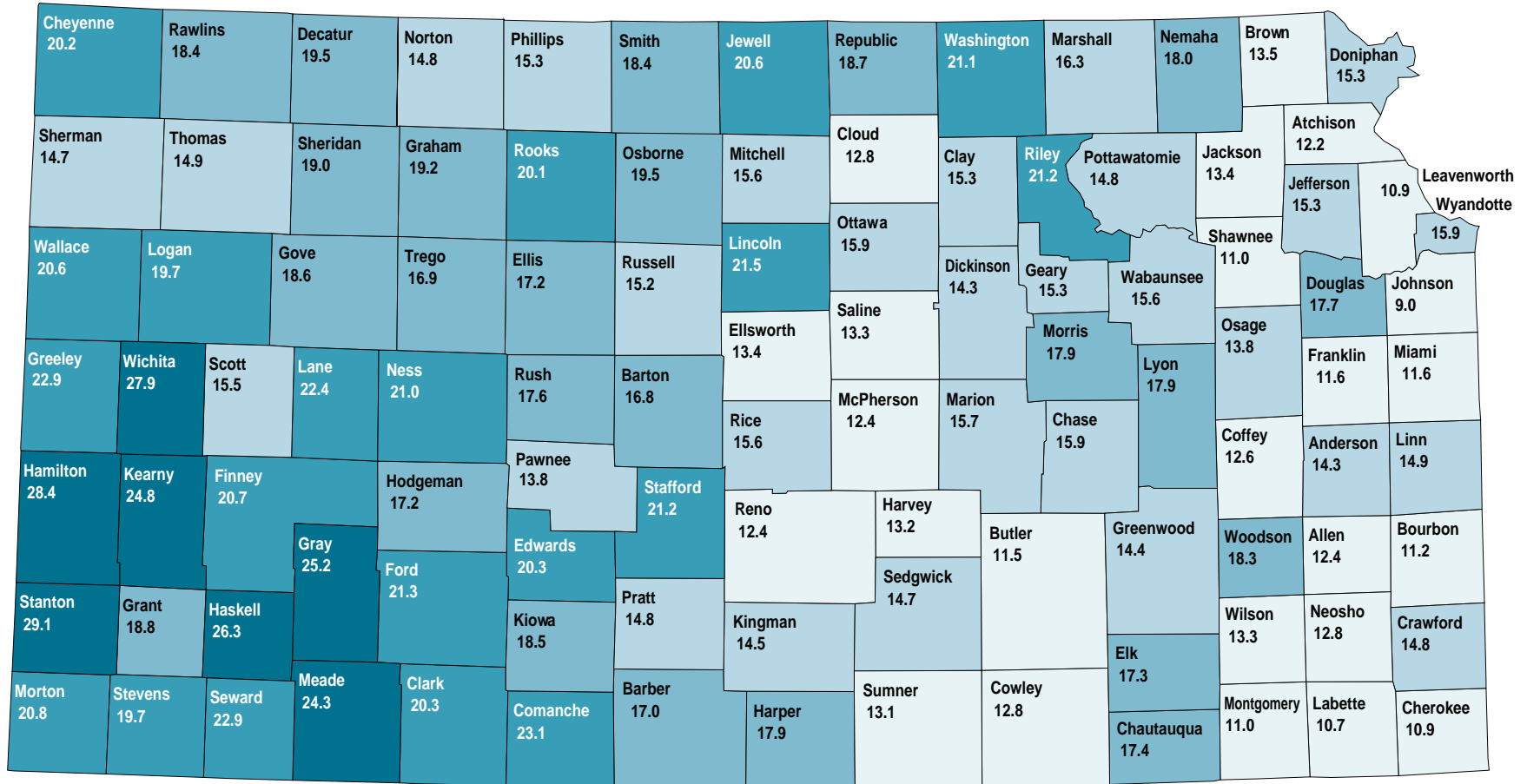

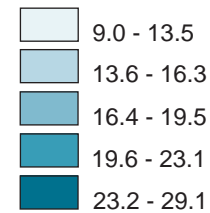
Percent of People Under 65 Without Health Insurance in Kansas by County, 2007
